1 Kings 19:11-13

"He said, "Go out and stand on the mountain before the Lord, for the Lord is about to pass by." Refrain: Heja, heja, sisi ni moja. we are one.



Finding God in Thin Spaces

What are "thin spaces"?

Thin spaces are places and moments where the separation between the earthly and the divine feels thin. These thin spaces may appear in church, in nature, during quiet moments, or among friends, just to name a few. They often make us feel closer to God and allow us to strengthen our relationship with God.

As a youth group we've explored some of these thin spaces over the last year and discussed the different ways in which we encounter God. Today's bulletin cover shows the youth in some of our favorite thin spaces, and this page includes reflection prompts and activities that may help you find the thin spaces in your own lives.

Breath Prayer

Breath prayers are prayers made up of broken-up lines (typically from scripture, though they don't have to be). The first half of the prayer is prayed as you inhale, the second half as you exhale.

Here are some examples of breath prayers to try:

- 1. "Help me rest; give me peace."
- 2. "Out of darkness, into light."
- 3. "Fill me, Spirit, with your love."

A Moment to Reflect

We invite you to wake up early one morning this week and take a moment to reflect. You may choose to enjoy this activity with a loved one, or take time to reflect personally and check in.

- Reflect on a specific moment you felt close to God. Where were you? How did you feel?
- In youth we have talked about songs with which we have a deep connection are there any songs with which you feel a strong connection? What are they? Why do you feel connected to them?
- Think about some ways you could appreciate and become more connected to your thin spaces: places you could go, people with whom you could surround yourself, etc.
