Paul Hindemith (1895-1963)

Composed in 1937, Hindemith's second Organ Sonata was written at the beginning of what became known as the Organ Reform movement, which was prevalent in the United States from the 1930s through the 1970s. This movement marked a return to the Baroque style, both in terms of organ design and organ music. Hindemith's Neo-Baroque music marks a return to valuing strict counterpoint and form, although with a more contemporary harmonic language. This movement's tempo marking translates to "calmly moving" and is a lovely miniature.
